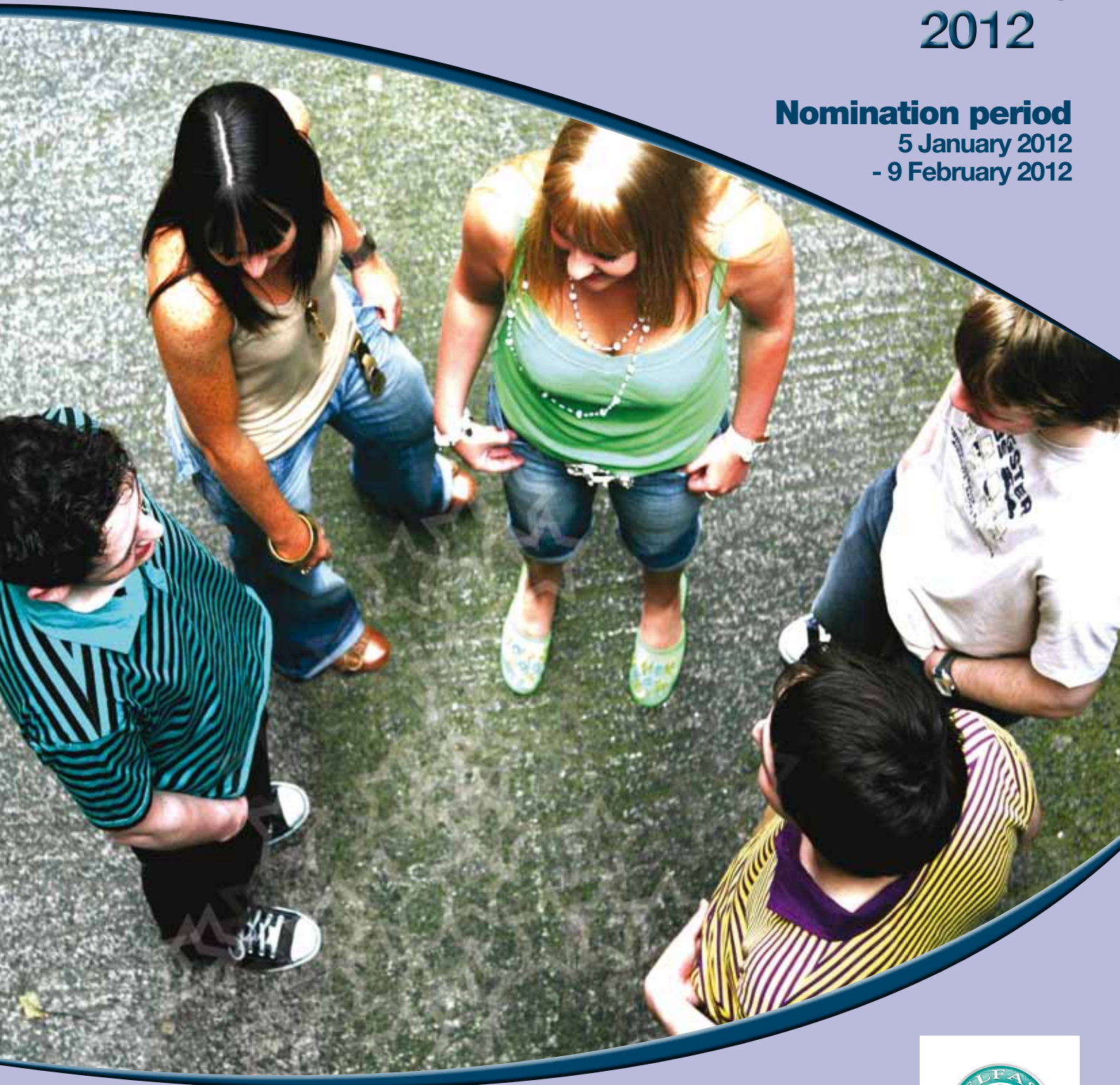

All nominees must live in the Belfast City Council area, and must be under 21 years of age.

## Award categories

There are five categories of awards.

### 1. Community Safety Awards

These awards are for excellence in addressing community safety at a local level. There are awards for north, south, east and west Belfast. These can be for individuals or groups who help make their community a safer place. Projects can include raising awareness of drugs and alcohol issues, consulting on youth related community safety issues and environmental work. A gold and silver award will be made in each area.

### 2. Belfast City Council Youth Forum Award

This award is for young people involved in work that has excelled at improving good relations in their local communities. For the purpose of this award this work should involve addressing one of the following issues: race, sexuality, disability or sectarianism. There will be one award of £750.

### 3. Thomas Devlin Award

Thomas Devlin was a 15 year old teenager who was murdered on 10 August 2005. The Thomas Devlin Trust was set up in his memory to promote public awareness of the effects and impact of violence against young people in Northern Ireland. This award will be presented to a project that addresses community safety issues through the arts. There will be one award of £750.

### 4. Linking Generations NI Intergenerational Award

This award is for young people involved in work that has developed intergenerational practice in their local communities. For the purpose of this award this work should demonstrate young and old participating in activities which promote greater understanding and respect between generations and contributes to building more cohesive communities. There will be one award of £750.

### 5. Youth Justice Agency Outstanding Achievement Award

The Youth Justice Agency works in partnership with a range of local community and voluntary organisations to address offending by young people and to help make communities safer. One award of £1,000 will be made at the judging panel's discretion to an individual or group who have demonstrated outstanding commitment and achievement in making their community a safer place.

## Community Safety Awards

There are prizes for each category.

#### Gold



£1,000 for the organisation that the young person has worked with, to help the project continue or develop.

#### Silver



£500 for the organisation that the young person has worked with, to help the project continue or develop.

#### Bronze



£250 for the organisation that the young person has worked with, to help the project continue or develop.
