Points of interest

Musgrave Park opened to the public in 1924. The park is named after Sir Henry Musgrave, who lived in nearby Drumglass House. He donated the land used to build the park.

The central pillar from the lower gateway at Fortwilliam Park in North Belfast was removed to make way for increased traffic. It was rebuilt in a flower bed just inside the Stockman's Lane entrance to Grovelands. The pillar dates from the 1870s and features the monogram of James William Valentine, the last owner of the Fortwilliam estate before it was divided up.

Musgrave Park is now home to a variety of sporting areas and a therapy garden.
