



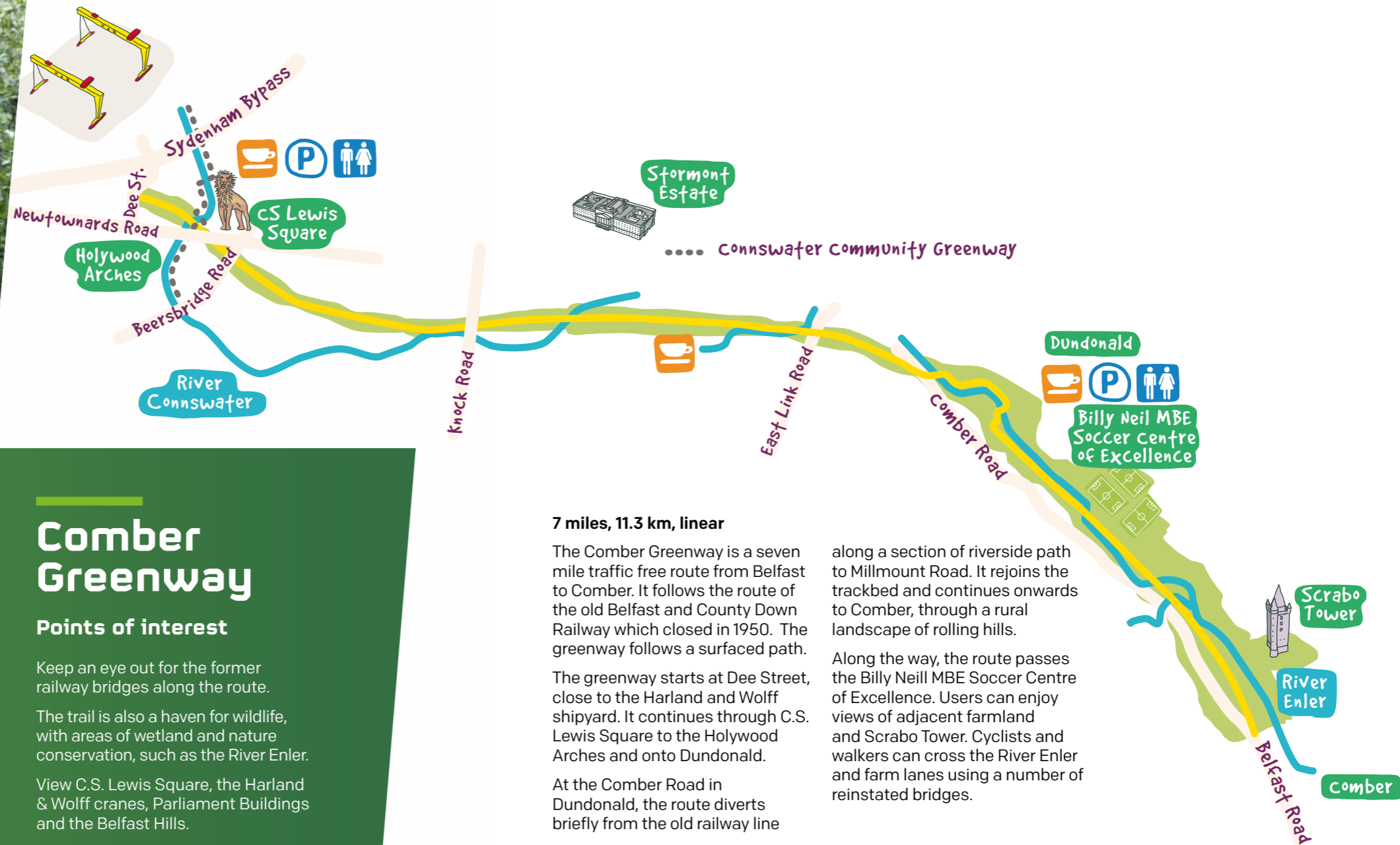
Comber Greenway

Points of interest

Keep an eye out for the former railway bridges along the route.

The trail is also a haven for wildlife, with areas of wetland and nature conservation, such as the River Enler.

View C.S. Lewis Square, the Harland & Wolff cranes, Parliament Buildings and the Belfast Hills.



7 miles, 11.3 km, linear

The Comber Greenway is a seven mile traffic free route from Belfast to Comber. It follows the route of the old Belfast and County Down Railway which closed in 1950. The greenway follows a surfaced path.

The greenway starts at Dee Street, close to the Harland and Wolff shipyard. It continues through C.S. Lewis Square to the Hollywood Arches and onto Dundonald.

At the Comber Road in Dundonald, the route diverts briefly from the old railway line

along a section of riverside path to Millmount Road. It rejoins the trackbed and continues onwards to Comber, through a rural landscape of rolling hills.

Along the way, the route passes the Billy Neill MBE Soccer Centre of Excellence. Users can enjoy views of adjacent farmland and Scrabo Tower. Cyclists and walkers can cross the River Enler and farm lanes using a number of reinstated bridges.
