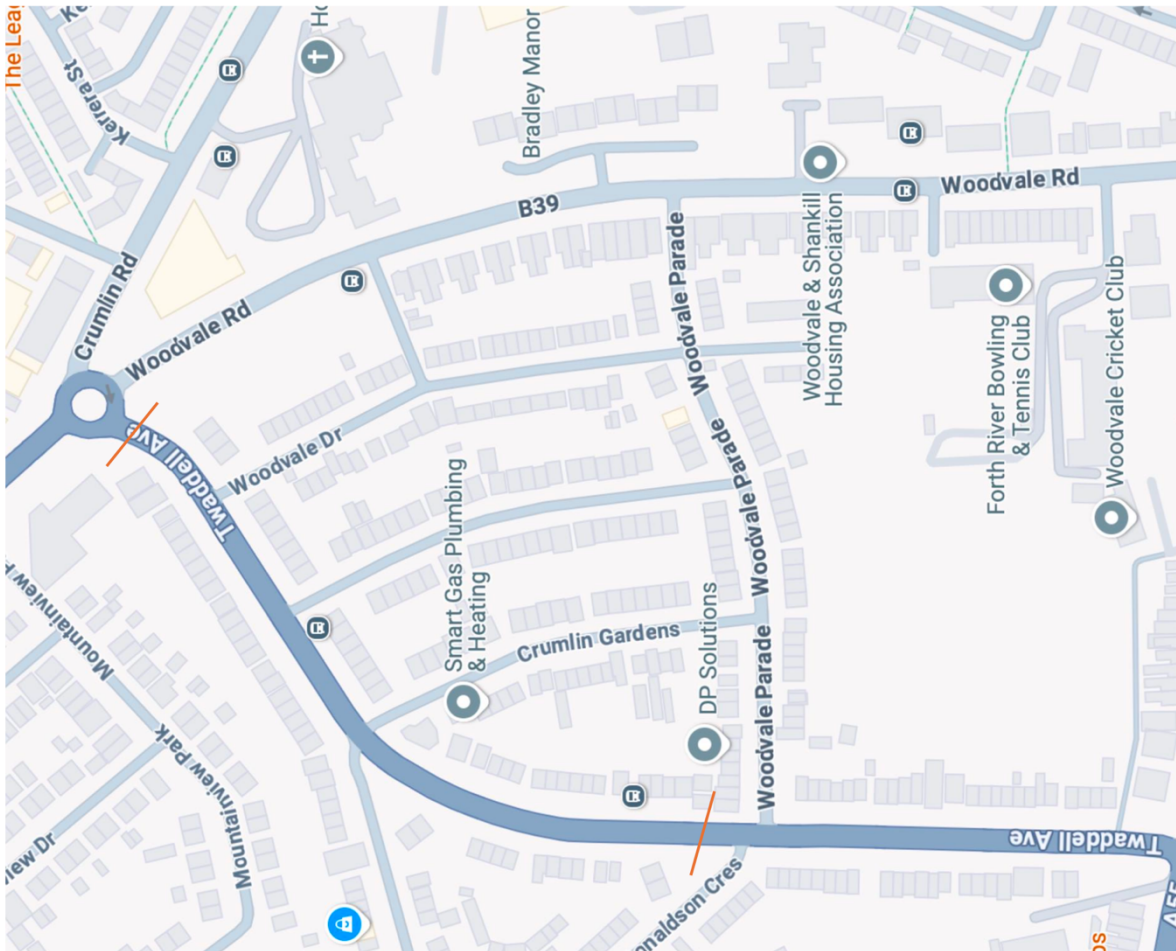


Traffic Management Plan
Twaddell Avenue
11.30am – 2.30pm 12th July 2025

1. Road Closure

The area of the road to be closed on Twaddell Avenue is outlined in the map below. The Road will be closed from 1 Twaddell Avenue to the Junction with Donaldson Crescent from 11.30am to 2.30pm to facilitate a street party and community event as outlined in the Event Management Plan.



Twaddell and Woodvale Residents' Association are responsible for closing the road to facilitate the party and have consulted with the PSNI and other emergency services as part of this process.

Signage will be installed to mark the Road closure and marshals will be present at each closure site to provide advice to vehicles on alternative routes and to ensure that the motorists abide by the closure.

2. Diversionary Routes and Access

Signage will be installed demarking the closure and alternative routes, including diversionary signage at Ballygomartin Road and Woodvale Parade.

Alternative Routes for traffic are:

- Woodvale Parade
- Ballygomartin Road

Access for residents to the streets:

- Woodvale Drive
- Crumlin Gardens
- Woodvale Gardens

Will be via Woodvale Parade.

Residents of Twaddell Avenue within the Closure area will be encouraged to move vehicles to the side streets outlined above, the Ballygomartin end of Twaddell Avenue (which remains open) and Donaldson Crescent in advance of the event. Within the marked area, there will be no permitted vehicle movement during the period.

All vehicles operated by suppliers will be stationary in the area prior to the road closure at 11.30am.

3. Pedestrian Access and Safety

There will be no restrictions on pedestrian access into the marked area during the period of the event.

The purpose of the road closure is to ensure the safety of pedestrians attending the event.

4. Emergency Access

In the event of an emergency, emergency service vehicles will be able to access the marked area.

To facilitate ease of access for emergency service vehicles, the inflatable games will be installed on one side of the road only to ensure a clear lane in the event of an emergency.

Marshals present at the closure points will facilitate access for emergency service vehicles into the area.

In the event of an emergency, volunteer community marshals will clear the road of pedestrians, and communicate the clearance of the area with the access marshals through radio.

5. Informing Residents of the Closure

Appendix A provides a copy of the letter provide to residents informing them of the closure. Letters will be circulated to the following streets:

- Twaddell Avenue
- Woodvale Gardens
- Crumlin Gardens
- Woodvale Drive
- Woodvale Parade
- Donaldson Crescent
- Woodvale Road (between Ballygomartin Road and Twaddell Avenue)

Appendix 1 – Residents’ Letter Sample

Twaddell and Woodvale Residents’ Association will be holding its annual street party on 11th July 2025 from 12.00pm – 2.00pm. To facilitate the safe operation of the street party the Twaddell Avenue will be closed from 1 Twaddell Avenue to the Junction with Donaldson Crescent from 11.30am – 2.30pm. Inflatable games will be installed on part of the Road.

Alternative Routes for traffic are:

- Woodvale Parade
- Ballygomartin Road

Access for residents to the streets:

- Woodvale Drive
- Crumlin Gardens
- Woodvale Gardens

Will be via Woodvale Parade.

We would be grateful if residents of Twaddell Avenue within the closure area could move vehicles to Woodvale Drive, Crumlin Gardens, Woodvale Gardens, the Ballygomartin end of Twaddell Avenue (which remains open) and Donaldson Crescent in advance of the event. Within the marked area, there will be no permitted vehicle movement during the period.

Emergency services will be able to access the area as normal.

We appreciate that the event may cause some disruption for you and we have aimed to minimize this as much as possible to ensure the event can take place safely.
