Main purpose of job

Reporting to the Employability and Skills Manager, the post will be responsible for:

Developing, leading and coordinating projects to support the delivery of priorities identified within the Employability and Skills Framework and the Belfast Agenda, in order to address economic inactivity, increase skills levels and deliver positive employment outcomes.

Managing assigned programmes of work which support the development and growth of the city and the economy, and which contribute to the ongoing delivery of the council's strategic priorities and the Belfast Agenda.

Developing and maintaining effective partnerships with other key organisations in both the public and private sectors to ensure a strategic, sustained and coordinated approach to employability and skills in the city.

Summary of responsibilities and personal duties

1. Contribute to the design, development and implementation of the Employability and Skills Framework and other relevant strategies, taking account of wider departmental and corporate objectives, including the ongoing delivery of the Belfast Agenda and the Belfast City Region Deal.
2. Identify, develop and appraise allocated projects in line with the Employability and Skills Framework and other relevant strategies in order to create employment opportunities, improve skills development and maximise opportunities to achieve positive employment outcomes.
3. Undertake relevant procurement exercises and effectively contract manage allocated projects within the Employability and Skills Framework in line with agreed outcomes and ensure appropriate financial and project management by project delivery agents.
4. Through employer and marketplace intelligence, build the business case for investment in a range of employability and skills initiatives in order to deliver opportunities and improve prosperity for the residents of Belfast, bringing together relevant partners as required.
5. Develop a range of targeted initiatives based on robust analysis, to create employability and skills opportunities within the city.
6. Identify, develop and maintain strategic partnerships with key agencies and individuals in the community, public, statutory and private sector in order to ensure a targeted and coordinated approach to employability and skills in the city.
7. Identify and pursue opportunities to work collaboratively with other Employability and Skills Officers and with colleagues across the Department and wider organisation in order to maximise the council's contribution to employability and skills and inclusive growth in the city.
8. Develop and cultivate local, national and international partnerships to share experience and best practice, develop relationships and exploit opportunities for the economic development of the Belfast City Council area.
9. Commission and carry out research which will track, monitor and evaluate the performance of the economy and will assist in the identification of appropriate mechanisms and initiatives to address the key employability and skills challenges in the city.
10. Draft reports, corporate briefings, policy responses and speeches for council members and officers and prepare committee reports.
11. Influence policy and strategy development both within council and with external agencies in order to support delivery of key strategic priorities.
12. Work with the Marketing and Communications team to develop and manage appropriate forms of communication in order to promote the work of the team including website, promotional materials, newsletters and press briefings.
13. Identify and attract relevant external funding opportunities to support the delivery of the employability and skills work programme and undertake the necessary applications and business cases required to access these resources.

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14. Implement effective monitoring, financial and administrative procedures pertaining to local government and external funder requirements.
 15. Represent Belfast City Council on all appropriate partnerships, strategic groups and advisory committees as required.
 16. Represent the Employability and Skills Manager as required.
 17. Organise events, conferences, exhibitions, visit programmes and other promotional activities.
 18. Participate as directed in the council's recruitment and selection procedures.
 19. Act in accordance with the council and departmental policies and procedures including customer care, equal opportunities, health and safety, safeguarding and any pertinent legislation.
 20. Participate in induction and in-service training provided by Belfast City Council and in the induction and support of all newly appointed staff and other human resource management procedures as appropriate.
 21. Undertake the duties in such a way as to enhance and protect the reputation and public profile of the council.
 22. Undertake such relevant duties as may from time to time be required.

This job description has been written at a time of significant organisational change and it will be subject to review and amendment as the demands of the role and the organisation evolve. Therefore, the post-holder will be required to be flexible, adaptable and aware that they may be asked to perform tasks, duties and responsibilities which are not specifically detailed in the job description but which are commensurate with the role.

Project management skills: good organisational skills with the ability to initiate, develop, manage and monitor complex projects and to oversee effective delivery by third party organisations.

Partnership working skills: the ability to establish good working relationships and work in partnership with a wide range of stakeholders across different sectors to develop and deliver a shared agenda to meet common objectives.

Analysis and decision-making skills: the ability to produce and implement new ideas and innovative solutions and the ability to make decisions which will contribute to enhanced project delivery.

Technical knowledge: knowledge of local and wider economic issues with recognition of key economic challenges and drivers in the city and identification of both the strategic and operational role for local government in addressing these.

Resource management skills: the ability to manage and monitor project budgets and associated project resources.

Team-working skills: the ability to work within a small team to ensure the delivery of agreed work objectives.

Political sensitivity skills: the ability to treat confidential matters with the appropriate discretion and the ability to work with elected representatives with an appreciation of the sensitivities of working in a political environment.

Belfast City Council is the Data Controller under the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR) for the personal data it processes relating to job applicants. Processing data from job applicants allows the council to manage the recruitment process, assess and confirm an applicant's suitability for employment and decide to whom to offer a job. It may also need to process data from job applicants to respond to and defend against legal claims.

If you apply for this job, you will be consensually providing your personal data to the council whose lawful basis for processing it is for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority.

The council will collect a range of information about you, including:

Appointment

The appointment will be made by the selection panel, but will be subject to ratification by the director of the relevant department.

There may be a reserve list of applicants drawn up for this post which would last for a maximum of 12 months. Should a similar post become vacant within this time, it may be offered to those on the reserve list, in order of merit, without further interview. For generic-type posts, this may include posts in another department. **These posts may be either full-time or part-time on a temporary or fixed-term basis.**

If you are offered and you accept a temporary position e.g. a temporary part-time position for 3 months, and another temporary part-time position arises from the same recruitment campaign e.g. for 1 year, regardless of whether or not you are still working in your temporary part-time position, you will not be offered any further temporary part-time position. However, in certain circumstances, when all relevant applicants on the reserve list for temporary vacancies, full-time or part-time, have been offered opportunities for which they expressed a preference on their application form, and if the timing of the reserve list is still valid and there are still temporary vacancies to fill before the reserve list expires, the council reserves the right to 'revisit' the reserve list in strict order of merit. This is the only time when an individual who has been appointed to a temporary position e.g. a temporary part-time position can be offered another temporary part-time position.

If a similar post does become vacant within this time, it will be offered to candidates on the reserve list in the following way:

1. Candidates will be initially contacted by telephone and **must** respond within three working days to accept or decline the post.
2. Candidates who cannot be contacted by telephone will be contacted by letter and **must** respond by telephone or by return of acceptance form within five working days of the date of the letter.

If candidates do not respond within the above time frames, the post will be offered, in order of merit, to the next person on the reserve list. The names of those candidates who have not responded within the above timeframes will be retained on the reserve list, in order of merit, to be considered for future vacant posts.

However, if candidates have been contacted on three separate occasions, and they have not responded within the above timeframes on these three occasions, the council will assume that they are no longer interested in the post and their names will be removed from the reserve list.

There is currently one temporary, full-time post until 30 November 2023, subject to review.

An existing permanent employee of Belfast City Council will, if successful, retain the right to return to their substantive post at the conclusion of the temporary period. An existing temporary or fixed term contract employee will, if successful, be appointed on the basis of a further temporary or fixed

term contract with no automatic right to revert back to their temporary or fixed term contract post. Similarly, an existing agency assignee will, if successful, be appointed on the basis of a temporary contract but with no automatic right to revert back to their original agency assignment. Temporary and fixed term contract employees and agency assignees should give consideration to this prior to applying or accepting this post.

Job details

Remuneration

The salary will be determined by the council in line with that determined by the National Joint Council for Local Government Services, currently Salary Scale PO3, SCP 32 to 35, £38,296 - £41,496 per annum (in normal circumstances, the starting salary is the minimum point), paid monthly by direct payment by the Bankers Automated Clearing System (BACS) to a bank or building society account of your choice.

Location

The person appointed will be based initially in 9 Adelaide, 9 – 21 Adelaide Street, Belfast but will be required to work in and/or visit other locations.

Pre-employment checks

Prior to taking up duty the person recommended for appointment must:

- (a) Enter into an agreement which sets out the main terms and conditions of employment.
- (b) Provide evidence of the right to work and reside in the UK via an original full UK birth certificate and original proof of national insurance number (for example, via national insurance card, P45 or payslip etc). No temporary national insurance numbers can be accepted. Individuals who do not have a UK birth certificate will be asked to bring their passport and other documentation as required.
- (c) Produce official evidence of their qualifications, as required. Please be advised that candidates must provide evidence to demonstrate that they were in possession of them at the closing date for applications.
- (d) Provide details of the bank or building society account to which their salary or wage will be lodged.
- (e) Provide two satisfactory work references. If suitably satisfactory references are not received, they will not be offered the appointment.
- (f) Pass satisfactorily a medical assessment by the council's Occupational Health Service provider.
- (g) Complete a disclosure of family relationships form.
- (h) Complete a disclosure of criminal convictions form, under the Rehabilitation of Offenders (NI) Order 1978. All applicants who are recommended for appointment to a post within Belfast City Council must provide details in respect of any criminal convictions which are not regarded as 'spent' convictions. Any disclosed convictions will be taken into account only when the conviction is considered relevant to the post and will be seen in the context of the job, the nature of the offence and the responsibility for the care of existing client/customer and employees.

If the person appointed acquires a conviction throughout the course of their employment with Belfast City Council, they must bring this to the attention of their line manager/departmental HR representative. Failure to comply with this request can result in a breach of the terms and conditions of employment and may result in sanction or dismissal. Any information will be dealt with confidentially and help is available.

Please note that if an applicant is recommended for appointment, they must complete the pre-employment checks, outlined above, within 10 working days or consideration will be given to withdrawing the recommendation for appointment and no formal offer of appointment will be made.

Council policies

The person appointed will be required to comply with all current and future council policies, procedures, guidelines, agreed working practices and any relevant collective agreements incorporated into the contract of employment.

Conditions

The general conditions of service as prescribed from time to time by the National Joint Council for Local Government Services and by the council for its officers shall apply to the appointment and the Single Status Implementation Agreement dated 2007 as renegotiated from time to time is hereby incorporated into the contract of employment.

A copy of the council's Disciplinary Procedure and Grievance Procedure will be issued to all new employees at the council's Induction Course.

Please note if you are an applicant with previous local authority service in England, Scotland, Wales etc., you are advised to clarify your particular situation with regard to the continuity of this service, prior to accepting an offer of appointment from Belfast City Council.

Service and hours of duty

The hours of duty are 37 per week, working five days per week, Monday to Friday. Flexible working hours are in operation between 7.30am and 6.30pm, with set core times that the person appointed must be in work. However, the person appointed will be required to start and finish work at specific times that suit the operational needs of the service and they will, when advised, be required to work outside of these hours for operational reasons including on extra statutory, bank and/or public holidays.

In accordance with the National Joint Council for Local Government Services National Agreement on Pay and Conditions of Service variations to the established working week or patterns of work will be reasonable and subject to adequate notice.

Annual leave

Annual leave and extra statutory, bank or public holiday entitlement is calculated in hours/minutes.

A person appointed on the standard full time hours of 37 per week will be entitled to 170.2 hours (23 days) annual leave, plus 88.8 hours (12 days) bank or other holidays.

Annual leave entitlement will be increased by 37 hours (5 days) in the case of officers who have not less than 5 years' continuous service and by a further 22.2 hours (3 days) in the case of officers who have not less than 10 years' continuous service.

Figures in brackets represent the number of days based upon a standard day of 7.4 hrs.

For individuals who do not work the standard full-time hours, annual leave and extra statutory, bank or public holiday entitlement will be calculated on pro-rata basis to their contracted hours, based on the standard full time hours of 37 per week and a standard day of 7.4 hours (i.e. 7 hrs 24 minutes).

Employees are entitled to a holiday with a normal day's pay for each of the statutory, general and public holidays as they occur. Where the balance of the employee's public / bank and statutory holiday entitlement has been exhausted, additional leave taken for public / bank and statutory holidays will be deducted from the employee's annual leave entitlement.

All employees required to work on extra statutory, bank or public holidays will be remunerated in accordance with Part 3, paragraph 2 of the National Joint Council for Local Government Services National Agreement on Pay and Conditions of Service.

The leave year commences on 1 April. If an employee starts part way through the annual leave year, the employee will receive annual leave entitlement on a pro rata basis, calculated on the number of days remaining in the current leave year from the first day of employment.

Sick leave

This scheme is intended to supplement Statutory Sick Pay and Incapacity Benefit so as to maintain normal pay during defined periods of absence on account of sickness, disease, accident or assault. Absence in respect of normal sickness is entirely separate from absence through industrial disease, accident or assault arising out of or in the course of employment with a local authority. Periods of absence in respect of one shall not be set off against the other for the purpose of calculating entitlements under the scheme. Employees are entitled to receive sick pay for the following periods:

Superannuation

The person appointed will automatically become a member of the Local Government Pension Scheme (Northern Ireland) LGPS (NI) in line with scheme regulations. They may opt out of the scheme. However, the council is required to comply with automatic enrolment provisions and will automatically enrol the person appointed at certain times. The LGPS (NI) is administered by Northern Ireland Local Government Officers' Superannuation Committee (NILGOSC) (www.nilgosc.org.uk).

Canvassing

Canvassing in any form, oral or written, direct or indirect, will disqualify an applicant for appointment. Candidates can, however, contact the relevant department for further information about the post. The person from the relevant department who provides further information should not be a member of the selection panel.

Notice

The minimum period of notice to be given by an employee shall normally be the ordinary period from one payment of salary or wages to the next.

Belfast City Council may terminate an employee's employment with the council by giving the following period of notice:

Probationary period

The person appointed may be required to complete a six month probationary period, if this is a requirement of the relevant department, and during this time one week's notice will be given by the council to terminate employment.
