We're very well connected

Due to its key strategic location, Belfast has traditionally looked outward and welcomed strong connections with the rest of the world.

Uniquely located to support firms operating across the UK, Ireland, Europe and the US, Belfast is geographically compact, easy to navigate and well serviced by road, rail, air and sea. London is one hour away by air, and there's local access to flights to over 180 destinations in 40 countries from two regional airports located 30 minutes drive from the city centre. Dublin airport is just 90 minutes away by road.

Northern Ireland boasts the highest availability of ultrafast broadband and 4G in the UK, giving Belfast a distinct advantage in the digital arena for companies that need reliable and fast connectivity. Belfast is one of 6 UK Cities which will see the launch 5G services in late 2019 boosting digital connectivity. It also benefits from the fastest direct broadband from Europe to North America. This vital link has helped attract some of the world's leading companies and contributed to the phenomenal growth of knowledge economy in recent years.

Belfast is set to be one of the world's leading cyber economies by 2026. This ambition will be realised because of a resilient infrastructure of talent, innovation and pioneering research that has developed in the city over the last three decades.

Belfast is now the world's number one destination for US-based cyber tech investment. With over 1,200 people currently employed in tech-related jobs, the city is fast becoming a global hub for cyber security.

One of the focal points is the Centre of Secure Technologies (CSIT), the UK innovation and knowledge centre for cyber security. The largest of its kind in the UK, this flagship centre counts BAE Systems, Infosys, IBM and Thales, amongst its partners.

Cutting-edge developments in new technology have also made Belfast the European leader in software development. Companies specialising in financial software, data analytics and encryption, access control systems, intelligent surveillance technologies and cyber security all have bases in the city.

Financial and Professional Services











Belfast is one of only eight recognised UK financial centres, and it's specialisms include asset management, fund administration, operations, risk, regulation and compliance.

A pipeline of over 5,000 graduates across disciplines such as finance, accounting, economics, law and computing provide a ready supply of skills and talent to support this growing sector.

A young population and highly skilled workforce ensures there is a wealth of talent available across the film, animation, music, mobile, gaming, and TV subsectors. This represents a diverse and easily accessible supply chain for the creative and digital industries.

Belfast's reputation as a location for film and television production has grown significantly in recent years. The city is home to major TV and film productions including HBO's Game of Thrones, The Fall and the new Warner Horizon series, Krypton.

Belfast is one of the fastest growing creative clusters in the UK and home to over 1,600 companies employing 20,000 people.

Hospitality and Tourism









Lonely Planet rates Belfast as the No.1 destination in the world to visit in 2018

Belfast is not only a great place to do business, it's also a great place to visit. Voted the world's number one destination for 2018 by Lonely Planet, Belfast attracted a total of 118 cruise ships with over 180,000 visitors¹ on board.

Business tourism is flourishing in the city with 29,000 conference delegates in 2018. It is also home to Titanic Belfast, which was named the Best International Experience in 2018. The city is home to Michelin star eateries, world class venues for music, theatre and entertainment.

Tourism contributed £2.5m per day in 2018 to the Region's economy, and the city saw 1.48m overnight stays. It's no surprise that Belfast is now the number one city in the UK for hotel investment, 1,200 rooms were completed in 2018. The city is outperforming its target to bring an additional 3,000 rooms to the market by 2021.

These, and other development opportunities in this sector, will contribute to Belfast's ambition to double the value of tourism by 2020.
